

# Are You Ready for Backyard Chickens?

## **Space Requirements**

- Is your yard free from hazards like toxic plants or unsafe fencing?

## **Local Regulations**

- Have you checked your city or county regulations for backyard chickens?
- Do you know how many chickens you're allowed to have?
- Are roosters permitted in your area? (Spoiler alert: many places don't allow them!)
- Are there homeowner association (HOA) rules about keeping chickens?

## **Time Commitment**

- Can you dedicate daily time to feeding and watering your chickens?
- Are you prepared to clean the coop regularly (about once a week)?
- Do you have time to collect eggs daily and check on your flock's health?

## **Budget Check**

- Do you have a budget for building (or buying) a coop and run?
- Can you afford ongoing costs like chicken feed, bedding, and health care supplies?
- Do you have a little extra saved for unexpected expenses like predator-proofing or vet visits?

## **Coop Setup**

- Have you planned for a predator-proof coop? (Think sturdy materials, secure latches, and hardware cloth!)
- Is your coop big enough to house at least 4 sq. ft. per chicken?
- Do you have proper lighting, ventilation, and nesting boxes set up?
- Have you thought about how you'll provide weather protection year-round?

## **Predator Protection**

- Is your yard safe from common predators like raccoons, hawks, and foxes?
- Are you prepared to install features like a covered run, motion-activated lights, or electric netting if needed?

## **Egg-citement Level**

- Are you excited to collect fresh eggs regularly?
- Are you prepared to handle surplus eggs if your hens are highly productive?

## **Long-Term Commitment**

- Chickens can live 5-10 years; are you ready for a long-term pet?
- Are you cool with possibly having fewer or no eggs as your chickens age?

- Is everyone in your household onboard with raising chickens?
- Do you have a plan for chicken care during vacations or busy times?
